Associate's Degree in Nursing (ADN) to Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN)



Take the next step in your healthcare career by becoming a clinical nurse at BIDMC

- BIDMC's Nursing Department and BILH Department of Workforce Planning and Development have partnered with Emmanuel College of Nursing to develop a program which will support the Nurse Resident through managing career and educational commitments.
- BIDMC typically requires a Baccalaureate degree in nursing to enter into a new graduate nursing role.
 However, this specialized BIDMC Program creates a pathway to the Nurse Residency role for new
 Associate's Degree graduate nurses, by providing them with the opportunity to work as nurses and covering the costs of their studies in an RN to BSN Program at Emmanuel College.

Highlights of the program

- Hired into BIDMC as a Nurse Resident
- Enrolled into the RN to BSN evening programs at Emmanuel College with strong academic supports
- Scheduled for 36 hours/week with 32 hours working on their assigned unit and 4 hours of professional development commitments
- Registered into BIDMC's Transition to Practice Nurse Residency program, which includes onsite and online curriculum aimed at developing leadership, clinical judgement, and decision-making skills as a nurse

Supports in this program include

- Coverage of the cost of participants' tuition, books and fees
- Paid 8-week clinical practicum at start of program
- BIDMC's 12-week, competency-based orientation period for new nurses
- Transition to Practice Nurse Residency Program
- Assignment to a BIDMC nurse mentor to assist in the transition from school to clinical practice
- Other on-site supports, such as cohort meetings to facilitate shared learning
- Instruction from Emmanuel College professors
- Academic support from Emmanuel's Academic Resource Center
- Program staff to assist with managing professional and educational obligations and accessing resources as needed

Who is eligible?

In order to be eligible for this opportunity, applicants must:

- Be a graduate of an accredited Associate's Degree in Nursing program
- Obtain MA license by September 1, 2025
- Possess AHA Basic Life Support (BLS) certification
- Be able to participate in online learning modalities
- Be interested in building a career in nursing at an Academic Medical Center
- Be highly motivated and set high standards for self
- Be available to work 36 hours/week while also going to school

How are participants selected?

Applicants selected to participate in the program will be hired as full-time employees through a competitive application and interview process.

Applicants will be asked to fill out an application and submit transcripts and a personal statement. Applicants will then be informed if they have moved on to Round II, which consists of job shadowing, a panel interview and references.

Applicants must pass the NCLEX and have license information posted on the Massachusetts Health Professions License Verification website by September 1, 2025
